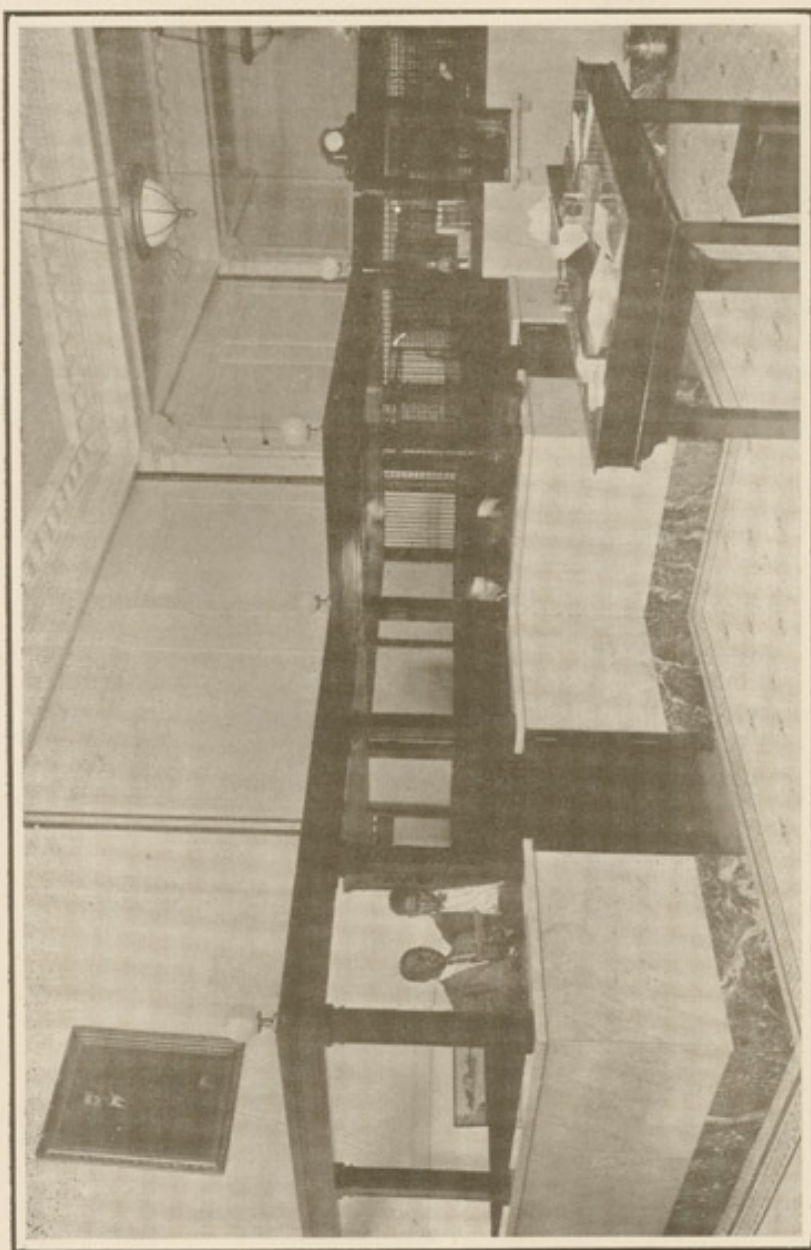

Showing the progress of a race.

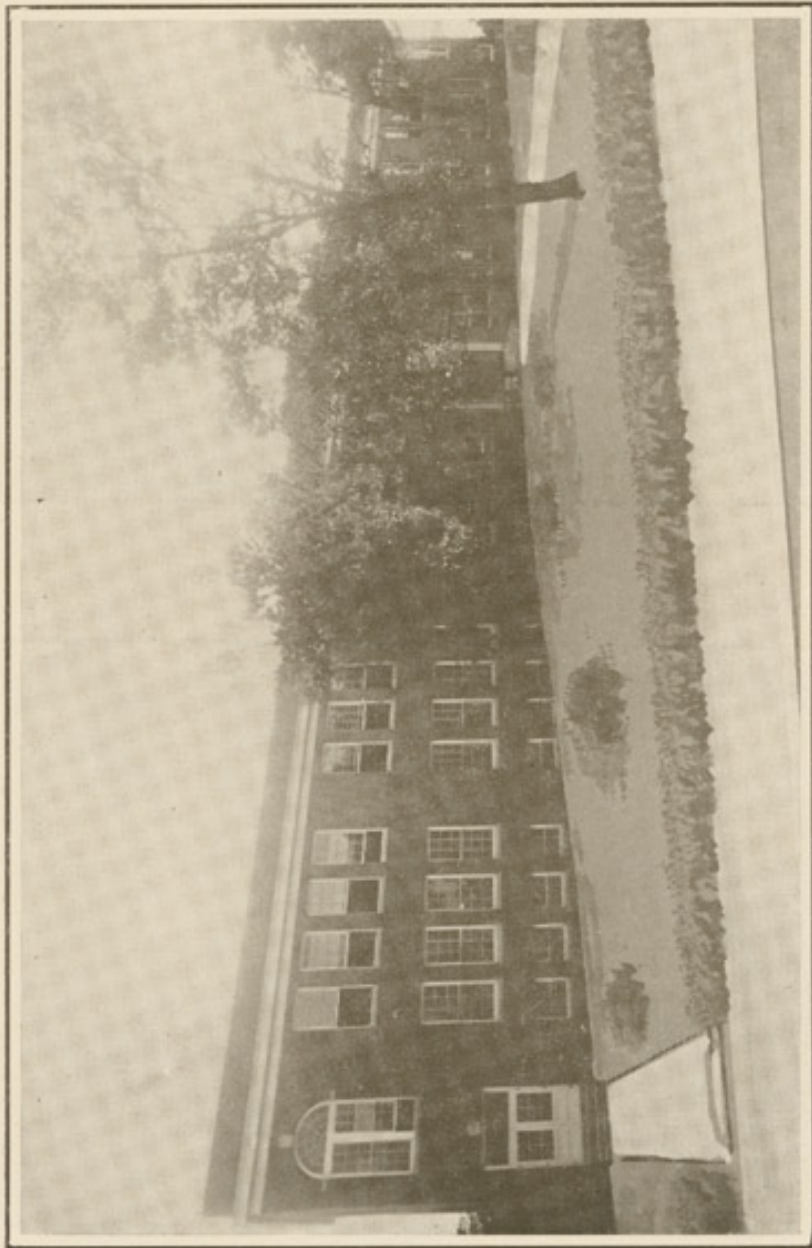

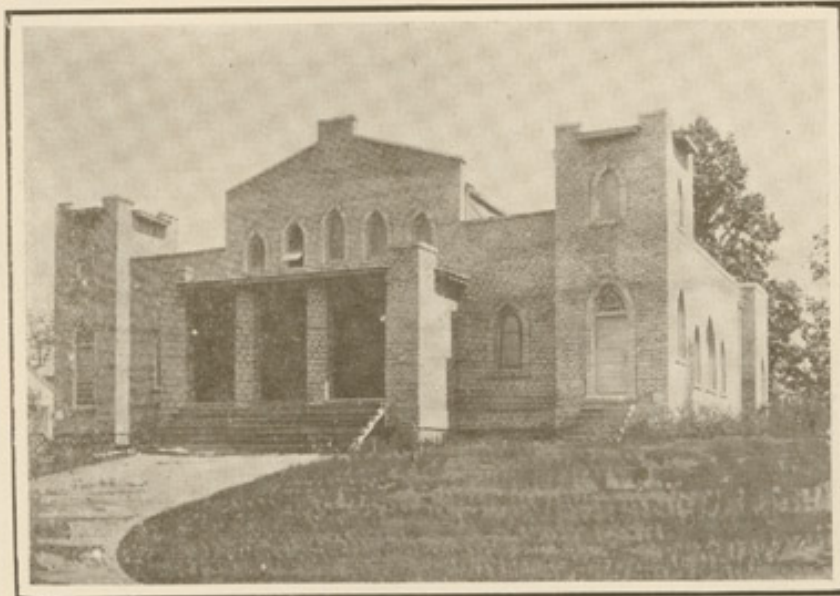

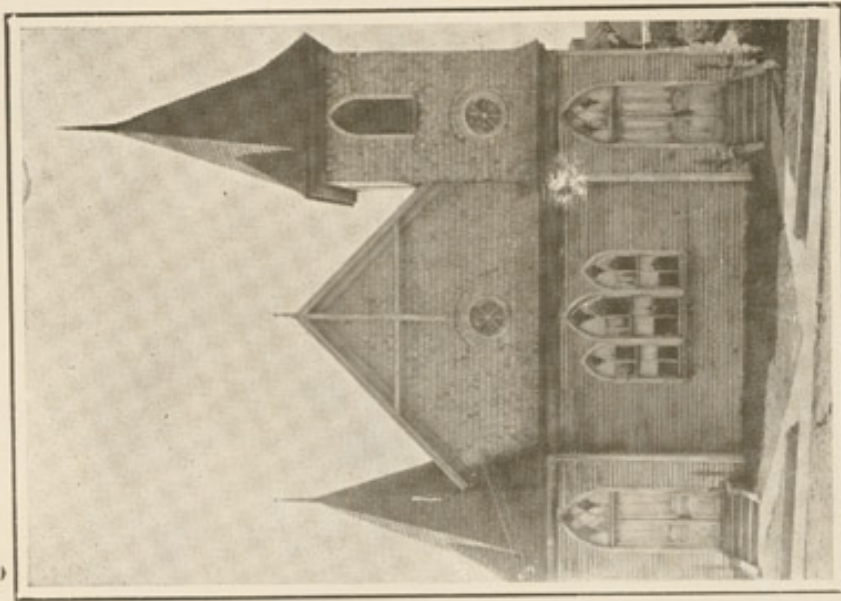

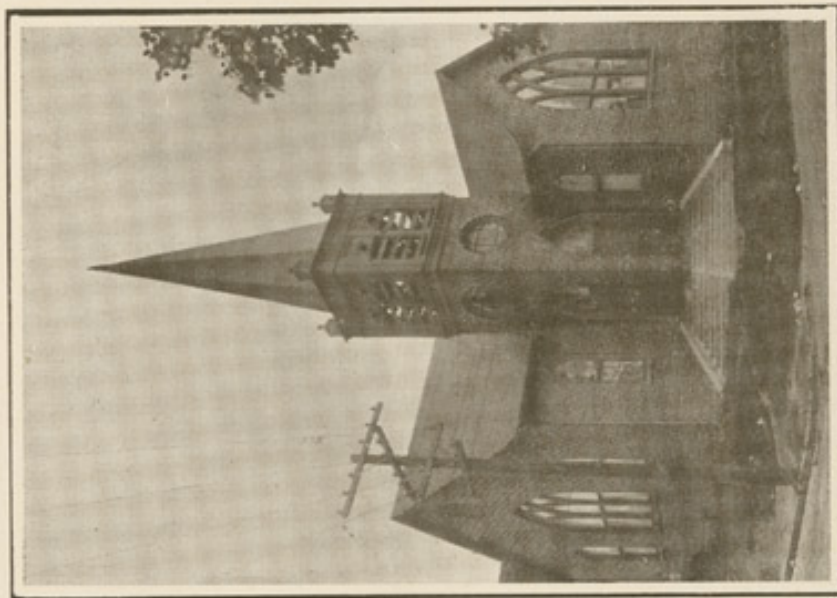

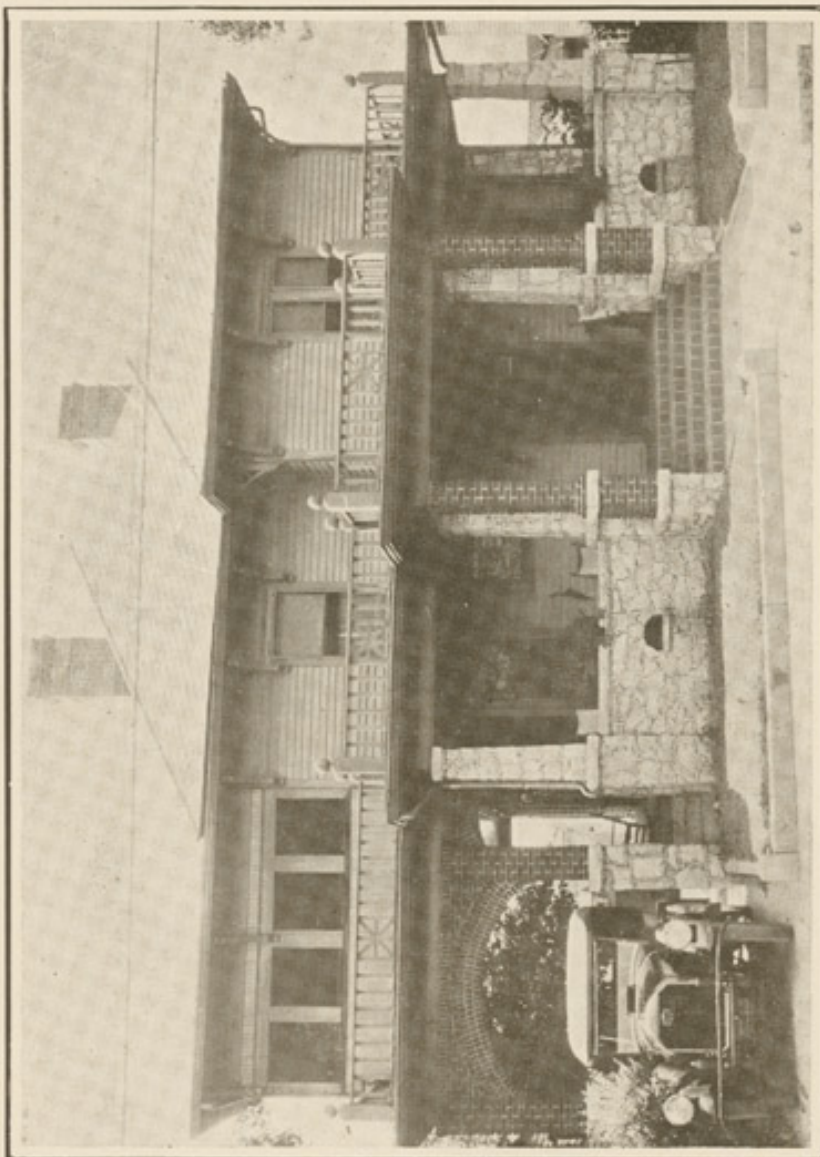

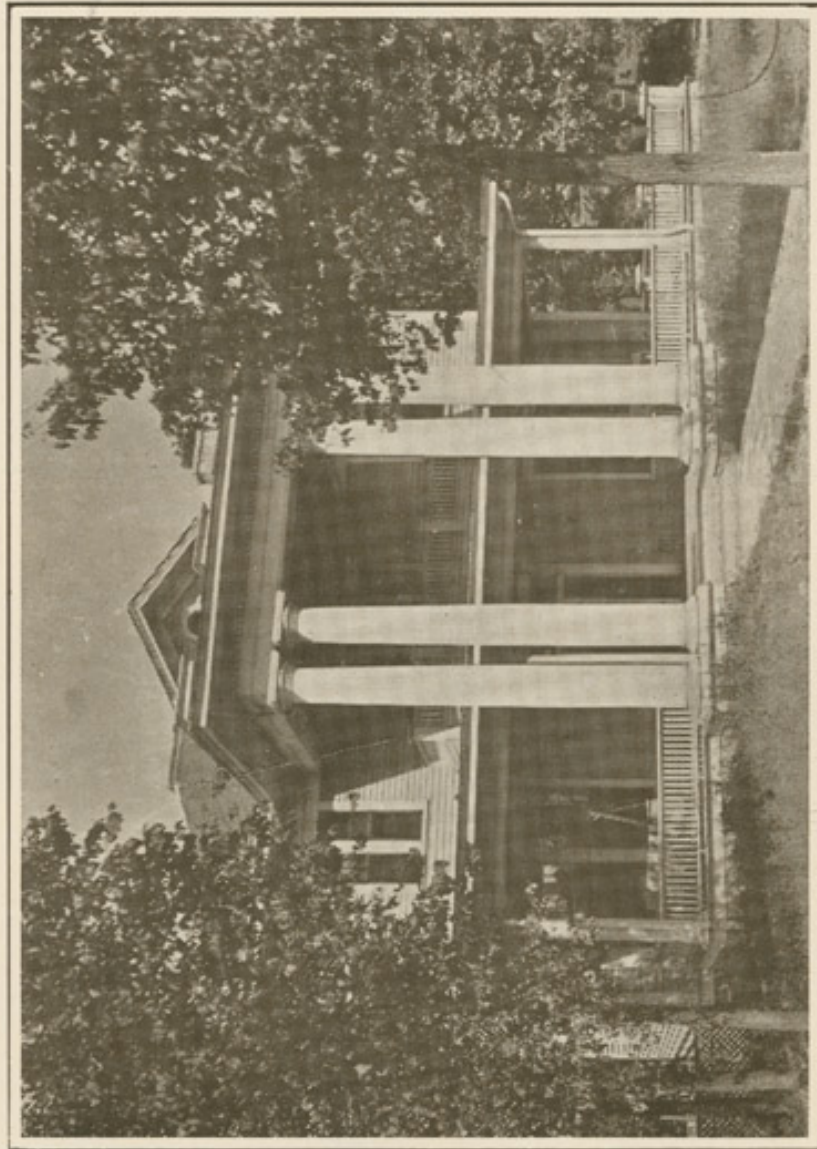

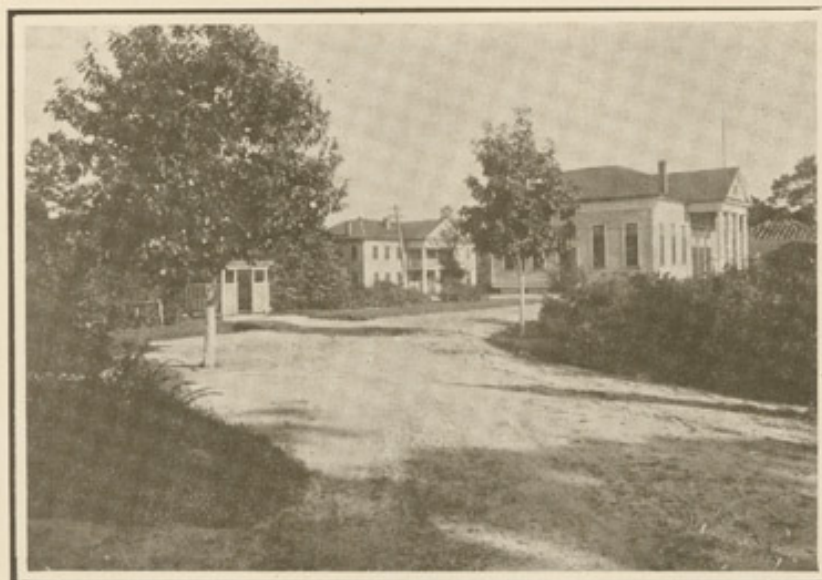
